Subject: Anti-Predator House Bills

I am extremely concerned to learn about the existence of bills in the House that are extremely anti-predator and meant to defeat the intent of the voter-approved Measure 18 regarding hunting in this State. House bills 2050, 3140, 3188, 3514 and 3515 are aimed against wolves, cougars, and other natural predators of Oregon.

From what I understand, one of these bills would allow the use of dogs in hunting cougars, something that Oregon voters have rejected repeatedly. I understand that another of these bills would prohibit the State from passing any regulations in defense of wolves. I want you to know that as an Oregon resident I am proud of Measure 18 and laws passed to defend wildlife and wild lands. I am proud that the many, many organizations across this country trying to stop the second annihilation of wolves (being led by Idaho, Wyoming, and other western states) have recognized Oregon's protection of wolves to be a model for other states.
