Measure Description:

Requires bidder that submits bid for contract for public works with estimated contract price of \$1 million or more to demonstrate responsibility by belonging to local joint committee whose training agents, in aggregate, employed apprentices for 10 percent or more of hours that training agents' employees worked on contracts in previous calendar year or by showing that bidder employed apprentices for 10 percent or more of hours that bidder's employees worked on contracts during previous calendar y

Government Unit(s) Affected:

Bureau of Labor and Industries (BOLI), Cities, Construction Contractors Board (CCB), Counties, Department of Administrative Services (DAS)

Local Government Mandate:

This bill does not affect local governments' service levels or shared revenues sufficient to trigger Section 15, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

Analysis:

This fiscal impact statement is for the purpose of transmitting the measure from the Senate Committee on Workforce to the Joint Committee on Ways and Means. The bill establishes new requirements on public contracts and specifies duties and responsibilities for the Bureau of Labor and Industries, including reporting to the Legislature. The bill also establishes requirements for contractors and subcontractors, as well as for local joint training committees. It is anticipated that there is a fiscal impact associated with this bill, but the amount of this impact is still being determined. A more complete fiscal analysis on the bill will be prepared as the measure is further considered
