Measure Description:

Modifies statutes relating to the Behavior Analysis Regulatory Board. Requires Board to establish by rule criteria and procedures for the licensing of behavior analysts, and assistant behavior analysts, as well as the registration of behavior analysis interventionists

Government Unit(s) Affected:

Oregon Health Authority (OHA)

Local Government Mandate:

This bill does not affect local governments' service levels or shared revenues sufficient to trigger Section 15, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

Analysis:

This fiscal impact statement is for the purpose of transmitting Senate Bill 696 with the – 4 amendment from the Senate Committee on Health Care to the Joint Committee on Ways and Means.

The bill modifies statutes relating to the Behavior Analysis Regulatory Board, including adding two more members to the Board. The bill requires the Board to establish by rule criteria and procedures for the licensing of behavior analysts, and assistant behavior analysts, as well as the registration of behavior analysis interventionists.

The bill is anticipated to have a fiscal impact on the Oregon Health Authority. The amount of this impact is still being determined.

A more complete fiscal analysis on the bill will be prepared as the measure is considered in the Joint Committee on Ways and Means.
