

  - Led to the establishment of a joint agency oversight committee comprised of community decision-makers

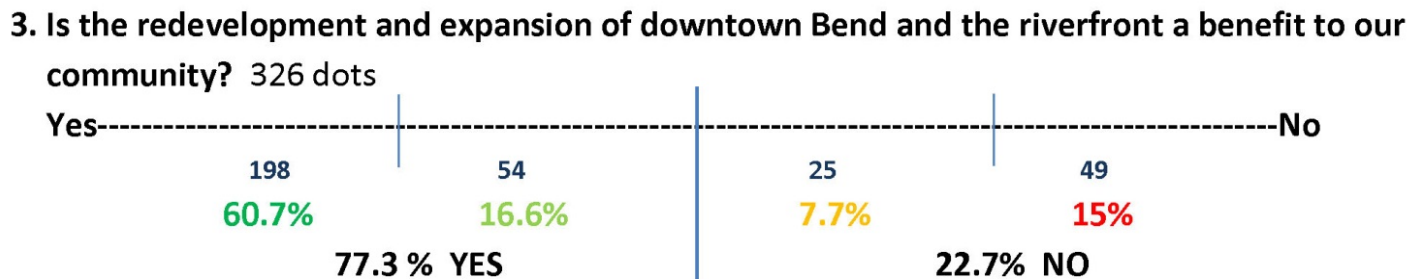
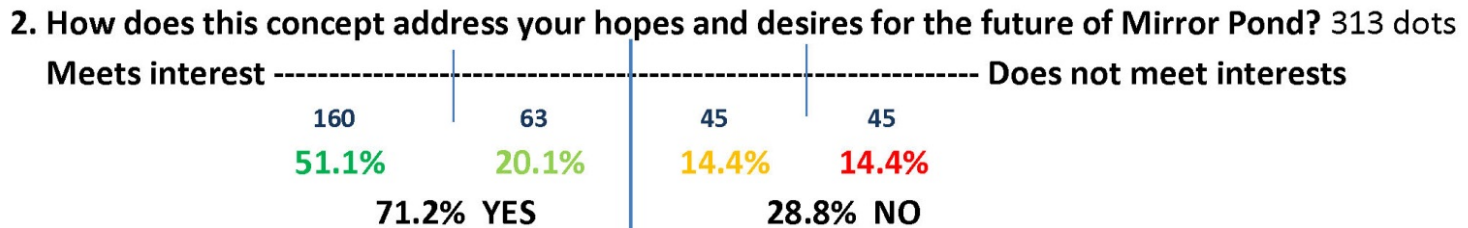
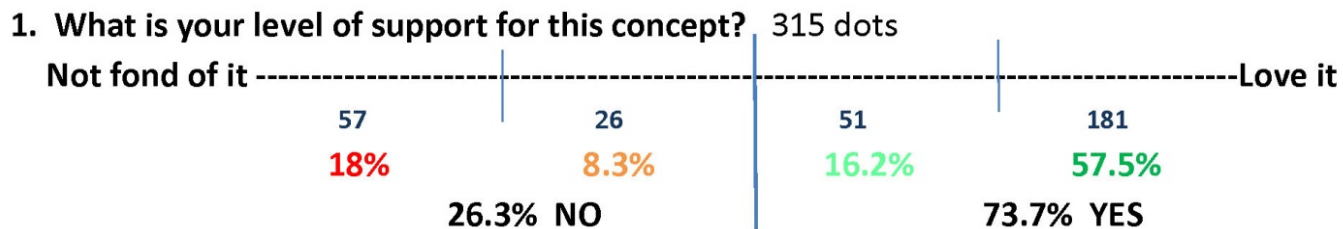
