Hello:

I am strongly opposed to SB 941 extending the failed Oregon background check requirement to the private sale or transfer of firearms in Oregon.

The current system is simply an infringement on the 2nd Amendment rights of lawabiding citizens. No criminal or mentally ill individuals -- the very ones we seek to stop -- will be slowed by such infringements; they will simply lie, steal, or go to the black market. Criminals have an easy time circumventing the law. It is their stock and trade.
