

Dear Representatives,

I have major concerns about OR SB941 as it is written.

First I do not believe that it will act as a deterrent to Criminals obtaining guns to use in the process of a crime. Second, it will do nothing but add a huge burden to law abiding firearm owners to sell, trade, or buy firearms from a legal gun owner or collector. The unfair cost burden on the transaction is overreaching at best. \$10 for the Background Check and a FFL fee of anywhere from \$20 to \$100.

There are already sufficient laws on the books that if enforced would help in the safe transfer of person to person gun sales. I have as a responsible owner sold a gun to a friend, but I required that he gave a copy of his OR driver's License and signed a bill of sale with a description of the firearm and the serial#. Also I know that he was OK because he had a Oregon Issued CCW and I knew that he had recently purchased a firearm through a FFL dealer so he had passed a background check.

I feel that there are many alternatives to this most onerous and unfair legislation. Please consider reasonable alternatives, including the possession of an Oregon CCW license, a buyers purchased background check certificate that is good for 60 days, etc.
