My name is Earl William Owen and I am an Oregon resident living in district 51 and I am a U.S. Army retiree. I served our nation and Oregon for 27 years and was a military police officer, so firearms as I am sure you would assume were an integral part of my duties and life. However, I have also maintained a close watch on this vital freedom guaranteed under the U.S. Constitution to all citizens not just the military and stayed involved at the state level wherever I was stationed. I was actively involved in Maryland during that states push toward extreme gun control policies and in just the short two years that their law has been in place, violent gun related crime has risen and the illegal possession of firearms has not been effected in the least.
