The bill in it's current form seems like an overreach.

- 1. The definition that "transfer" does not include loaning for hunting and target practice seems too narrow. As written, it seems to precluding giving it to a person to <u>take</u> the firearm <u>with them</u> to said activities. So now loaning means you have to be with them in the woods or at the range.
- 2. The requirement to go to a gun dealer to do a background check seems excessive. From what I understand, an individual can call in a check themselves and get liability relief.

The goofy part is, if you live in a small town, you have to travel to the nearest city (with a gun dealer) to sell a rifle to your next door neighbor.

While the Senate did attempt to fix this part in the bill; if the sale doesn't go through the seller will have to drive to the gun dealer to get it back -- due to federal rules.
