**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:** Prohibits health providers from practicing conversion therapy if recipient is under 18. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

**EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:**

**BACKGROUND:** Conversion therapy (also known as reparative therapy) is psychotherapy aimed at changing a person's sexual orientation from homosexual to heterosexual and is generally based on the view that homosexuality is a disorder.

In 2009, the American Psychological Association convened a task force to review the scientific data on efforts to change a person's sexual orientation or gender expression. The task force concluded there is no scientific evidence of effective or significant change.
