

Committee On Implementing Measure 91:

I have had much to say about the upcoming events, but I need to add another concern to my list. If it is not written in measure 91 already to cap the potency limit, say THC at 15% it well should be. This would prevent medical growers from selling into the recreational market as their strains must be as strong as possible in order to treat severe diagnosis. It would also help build the wall between the two industries should Federal defense become necessary.

As a citizen this is important to me because there is a drastic difference in the two types of users. Recreational users may not have the same respect for Cannabis law. Recreational users often co-use Cannabis with other substances such as alcohol, or other harder substances. The effects will be intensified and as a nonmedical patient these people would be far more likely to drive under the influence, become public nuisances, and engage in criminal activity.

Patients are about health. We want to heal and respect the law. In fact many patients are not even mobile without assistance. Cancer, HIV, epilepsy are debilitating on their own. Please consider amending 91 if needed to reflect a potency limit and prevent medical and recreational growers from co-mingling products.

Additionally I want to point out that as patients we should be protected under HIPPA. -15 is not backwards. Law enforcement does just that enforce. Allowing access to information at whim opens us up to target by corrupt officers and officers looking to make a name for themselves. Please protect our medical information and privacy.
