**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:** Adjusts school food and beverage nutritional standards to comply with federal food and beverage nutritional standards. Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2015.

**ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

**EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:**

-3 amendments (proposed) clarify that nutritional standards explicitly apply to students, rather than teachers, administrators or other school personnel.

**BACKGROUND:** The Oregon Department of Education (ODE) is responsible for managing the state and federal nutrition programs, including the federal Child Nutrition Program, that operate in Oregon schools. State standards for school nutrition can be found in ORS 336.423-441. ORS 336.423, created as a result of House Bill 2650 (2007), specifically defines nutrient standards, including calories and portion sizes, for foods sold at all K-12 public schools in Oregon.

House Bill 2404-A aligns Oregon food snack standards to new federal snack standards. The changes include, but are not limited to changes that: allow juices to be diluted with water; allow calorie-free flavored water up to 20 ounces; allow seeds, nuts, seed butters, and nut butters to be exempted from saturated fat prohibitions; and prohibit foods and beverages containing caffeine from being sold in elementary and middle schools.
