I would be happy to discuss with anyone the mechanics and physics involved with air and water cooled motorcycles and why it is simply not feasible nor advisable to allow them to sit in slow moving or at a standstill in traffic. Oil viscosity breakdown, Pre-ignition, detonation and clutch wear to name a few. As a federally licensed aerospace technician as well as licensed for instruction in mechanics I would welcome the opportunity to discuss the mechanics and why motorcycles and scooters should be allowed to pass at a reasonable speed in traffic jams or tie ups.

Please do not be swayed by those who do not ride or so passive aggressive they wish to control those who do. Listen instead to the voices of those who have the real world experience and knowledge. As a life long motorcyclist PLEASE pass this common sense bill. Thank you!
