

## Testimony on SB 472-A House Transportation and Economic Development Committee May 15, 2015 Ginny Lang representing Oregon State Capitol Foundation

## **Summary**

Increases maximum number of Pacific Wonderland license plates and dedicates proceeds to Oregon State Capitol Foundation and Oregon Historical Society

Good morning, Chair McKeown and members of the Committee. For the record, my name is Ginny Lang and I am a member of the Oregon State Capitol Foundation, representing Chair Fred Neal and the other Foundation members. I'm here today to urge your support of SB 472-A which comes to you with a unanimous vote from the Senate Business and Transportation Committee, the Senate Finance and Revenue Committee, and the full Senate.

SB 472-A authorizes an additional 40,000 Pacific Wonderland license plates with the proceeds to be evenly divided between the Oregon State Capitol Foundation and the Oregon Historical Society. The Foundation has used revenue from the initial 40,000 plates to launch the Oregon History Center which includes display cases and information kiosks located in the galleria. In addition, a great deal of developmental work is in progress for educational and display materials to be used in the future.

This bill allows the Foundation to use proceeds from the license plates for general purposes in addition to the History Center, just as the Historical Society does now. We believe this change will help us do a better job of moving forward on the History Center goals, while at the same time benefitting the rest of the Foundation's responsibilities as laid out in ORS 173.500.

We have worked with Senator Johnson, the sponsor of the bill, as well as with our Oregon Historical Society partner on this change. DMV has indicated they have no difficulties with the measure.

I encourage you to send SB 472 to the floor with a do-pass recommendation and I'm happy to answer any questions.
