

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

ODA

Responsible for ensuring the quality of in-state, non-exempt, private higher education programs and out of state private and public higher education programs offered to Oregon students.

VA-SAA

 Responsible for ensuring that the programs approved for the training of veterans offered in all postsecondary institutions in Oregon are quality programs.

PCS

 Responsible for ensuring the quality of private career schools, establishes business and fiscal standards, sets instructional and curricular requirements, and provides technical assistance.



OFFICE OF DEGREE AUTHORIZATION

Four key functions

- Evaluate and approve degree programs at certain private colleges located in Oregon
- Evaluate and approve distance (i.e. online) degree programs offered to Oregonians by colleges and universities located outside the state
- Enforce laws against diploma mills
- Coordinate the implementation of SARA State Authorization Reciprocity Agreement



OFFICE OF DEGREE AUTHORIZATION

Evaluates and approves degree programs at:

- A. All non-profit and for-profit degree-granting colleges,
- B. Colleges lacking regional accreditation, and
- C. Colleges that have been in Oregon under five years.
- Current approvals include 27 institutions offering 169 degree programs.
- Approved in-state institutions include: 14 non-profit, and 13 for-profit private institutions. They enroll over 12,000 students.
- Other Private, non-profit and regionally accredited institutions such as Willamette and Linfield are exempt from day-to-day ODA regulatory oversight. Independent institutions under the Alliance enroll over 45,000 students.

OFFICE OF DEGREE AUTHORIZATION

Evaluates and approves degree programs at:

Out of state degree granting colleges and universities, seeking to offer distance education (i.e. online) in Oregon.

Colleges that have regional and national accreditation located outside our state, and who seek to offer credit courses and degree programs in Oregon.

Current approvals include 116 authorized and 117 exempted institutions offering numerous degree programs. They serve over 5,000 Oregonians who enroll exclusively in distance education courses, with out-of-state providers.



PRIVATE CAREER SCHOOLS UNIT

Primary functions, Private Career School licensing unit

- License career schools doing business in Oregon
- Approve programs offered by new and existing schools
- Investigate and respond to complaints regarding career schools
- Provide significant technical assistance to licensees and license applicants



WHAT TRAINING DO THEY PROVIDE?

Oregon has about 193 private career schools that provide significant technical and vocational training opportunities for Oregonians in many diverse fields, such as:

WHAT ARE CAREER SCHOOLS?

- They are private, postsecondary institutions that offer career or vocational training. Primarily for-profit, but a few are incorporated as nonprofit entities.
- They are licensed, certificate-granting institutions.
- Current approvals include 193 schools, collectively offering 973 certificate programs.
- About 9,320 students are enrolled at Oregon Private Career Schools, and about to 3,793 graduate each year.
- Their graduates contribute to the middle '40' in Oregon's 40-40-20 goal.



OREGON'S PRIVATE CAREER SCHOOLS

- The Private Career Schools Licensing Unit mandates high standards for PCS's.
- Oregon Administrative Rules (OAR) require schools to be financially responsible, have approved curriculum, and provide evidence that a high level of completion and placement is being achieved.


