Douglas County started transferring from the Road fund to Patrol in fiscal year ending 2009 in response to the legislative change. Before that time, the Sheriff's office was funded from General Fund.

Historically, the amount of the transfer continues to rise due to increased costs associated with providing patrol services even after significant staff reductions. As an example, results from recent union negotiations impacted the budget approximately \$1.1 million dollars from fiscal year 2015 to 2016. The Sheriff's office is proposing to eliminate 6 FTE in FY16 down to 119.50 FTE and has decreased from 136.50 FTE in FY06. Here's a brief history of the transfer from Public Works to fund Patrol:

¹ Until FY 16, Lane County regularly transferred via a grant to the Sheriff's Office. The average transfer was \$2.68M between FY08 and FY15.

² I haven't heard back from Josephine County, but they have relatively little National Forests compared to O&C Lands. I believe their total USFS revenue from the most recent federal payment (FY15) was \$90K.

³ Coos County has never utilized the authority established by the Legislature in this regard.
