- Develop and sponsor programs in cooperation with Asian American groups and organizations to inform Asian Americans of services available to them
- Assess all programs of state agencies operating for the benefit of Asian American residents and make recommendations to the appropriate agencies for the improvement of those programs
- Submit a biennial report to the Governor describing the needs of Asian Americans and specifying the programs, projects and activities that the commission will undertake regarding those needs
- Work for the implementation and establishment of economic, social, legal and political equality for Asian Americans in Oregon and maintain a continuing assessment of the issues and needs confronting Asian Americans
