- Ten members serve four-year terms:
  - One psychiatrist experienced in the criminal justice system (**REICHLIN**)
  - One licensed psychologist experienced in the criminal justice system (**BALDUZZI**)
  - One experienced in parole and probation process (**MORRISON**)
  - One lawyer experienced in criminal trial practice (**LIEBER**)
  - One child psychiatrist experienced in the juvenile justice system (**McKELVEY**)
  - One licensed psychologist experienced in child psychology and the juvenile justice system (**MILLER**)
  - One experienced in juvenile parole and probation (**KUENZI**)
  - One lawyer with experience in juvenile law practice (**ALBA**)
  - Two members of the general public (**CASTEEL, SWETNAM**)
- No district attorney, deputy district attorney, or public defender may be a member
- Members are eligible for reappointment

**DUTIES AND AUTHORITY:    ORS 161.336, ORS 161.385, ORS 161.387 and ORS 161.395**

- The board retains jurisdiction over persons who are found “guilty except for sanity” in a court of law
- The work is divided between an adult panel and a juvenile panel, with each panel directing the care and treatment of those persons
- The board’s jurisdiction is equal to the maximum sentence provided for the crime
- The board’s primary purpose is to protect the public through the on-going review of the progress of those placed under its jurisdiction
- The board has authority to commit a person to the state hospital, conditionally release a person from the hospital to community-based program, revoke conditional release, or discharge person
- The board can promulgate interpretive rules necessary to carry out its responsibilities
