RE: HB 3494-A

Dear Senators:

My name is Dr. Aubrey Joseph Lavizzo. I am a veterinarian and veterinary practice owner in Denver CO and the Colorado state director of the international animal welfare organization Paw Project which has members in Oregon and I am writing to ask you to oppose HB 3494-A as it is written and to amend it to effectively prohibit the inhumane procedures performed on animals specifically known as declawing of cats and devocalization of dogs.

In the case of declawing of cats numerous reports in veterinary literature indicate the frequency of complications resulting in life-long pain and dysfunctional behavior and ambulation, and reports from animal shelters and rescue organizations indicate that a significant number of declawed cats are indeed relinquished for behavioral problems resulting from the declawing procedure, including biting and inappropriate urination.

Also, contrary to the implication that cat scratches are a significant cause of harm to immune-compromised persons, reports from the Centers of Disease Control suggest that immune-compromised persons are more likely to develop secondary infections from the handling of feces of animals, whatever the species.

Therefore I again urge you to oppose HB 3494-A as written on the grounds that it mistakenly targets cats as the cause of injury and illness in people and damage to property, and in so doing actually legitimizes cruelty to these animals.
