
Length of time spent addressing an incident, the, type of response, and the nature of the issue


# **Number and Percent of Responses by Position:**






## **Receiving Special Education Services versus Not**

## Percentage of Incidents by Grade Level






Elementary: Approximately <u>432 hours</u> from November 17-December 19, 2014 were spent on mental health related needs.

#### Nature of Issue: Elementary




#### Nature of Issue: Secondary

### Next Steps

#### Prevention:

- BSD is adding 5 social workers with general fund dollars. That is 5 less teachers that can be hired.
- Bring health providers into schools to provide mental health services directly to students where they are.
- Develop a task force to make recommendations on how education and the medical community can partner on providing mental health services to students.
- Find a way to break down the ODE, School District, Medical, Mental Health, and DHS silos.
- Increase supports for students already in crisis:
  - Evaluate access to day treatment and other mental services across the state for equity: Portland metro area v. the Oregon Coast.
