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### Package 801 LFO Analyst Adjustments

<u>Package Description</u> This package makes technical adjustments to recognize several Federal Funds grants: Byrne/Justice Assistance Grant funds \$5,466,568, Statistical Analysis Center (SAC) \$119,484, and Residential Substance Abuse Treatment (RSAT) at \$101,478. The SAC funds are used internally to help the agency maintain federal reporting requirements. RSAT funds support jail substance abuse treatment in one county. The remaining funds are nearly all for grants to local governments for specialty courts.

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### **Package 802 Justice Reinvestment**

Package Description This package provides General Fund for Justice Reinvestment grants to local criminal justice systems and treatment providers, \$23,715,150, and to add 2 positions to implement and administer the grant program, \$379,552 Personal Services and \$905,298 Services and Supplies. The positions are one Program Analyst 3, One Research Analyst 2. The half-time Accounting Technician is increased to 1.00 FTE. In addition, part of the S&S addresses unfunded, ongoing costs associated with the addition of a JRI Program Analyst 4 in the 2013-15 budget.

Added to base General Fund of \$10 million, the total available for Justice Reinvestment grants is \$33.7 million.
