Dear House Committee on Rules:

I would like to offer some comments regarding H.B. 2668 A and I would certainly appreciate the opportunity to provide testimony in this matter.

I am an Industrial Hemp and Seed Production license holder through the Oregon Department of Agriculture. I oppose this legislation and all the amendments to it. I oppose both the 5 mile buffer and the 3.5 mile buffer. I am aware of the issues of cross-pollination and could speak extensively about this issue if asked to. In the future I would entertain a pinning system. However, the time to start such a system is not after producers have planted and are in the middle of a growing season.

I am a cannabis law and production expert. I have extensive knowledge about cannabis production, including hemp production. This legislation is based on an over-reaction by some outdoor growers. I currently represent many medical cannabis growers and once they are given the facts, they tend to look at this issue more rationally.

I am about to leave for Salem and plan to attend today's hearing. If there would be time for brief testimony, I am sure that I could answer any questions and provide some insight that the Committee would find useful in analyzing this bill and the issues it presents.
