Subject: HB 3304 Relating to licenses issued by the State Landscape Contractors Board

Work Session Recommendation

House Bill 3304 requires the Landscape Contractors Board (LCB) to design and offer, as an alternative to a written exam, a practical skills test for persons applying for a landscape construction professional license. The bill also requires the board to offer the option of practical skills tests, and written exams in Spanish. The bill requires the board to offer or approve a class on landscape contracting business practices. The board is directed to report to the legislature by September 15, 2016 regarding the implementation of these options.

The measure previously had hearings in the House Committee on Business and Labor on 4/8/2015 and 4/20/2015. The measure also had a public hearing in this Committee on May 19, 2015.

The original staff measure summary, the – A7 amendment, and the fiscal impact statements are attached to this memo, and available on the Oregon Legislative Information System (OLIS).

Fiscal impact

Passage of this bill will have an Other Fund impact to the agency's fee structure. If this bill passes, the board will have to either contract with vendors or develop in-house capacity to supply the exam materials, scoring tools for the exam, proctors for the exams, and change its forms and applications to allow for the option of requesting: 1) a written exam or a practical skills test; and 2) practical skills tests and written exams in Spanish. At this time, the board is working to quantify these costs fully.

The board predicts a rough estimate of the total direct cost of offering the testing options required by this bill to be approximately \$105,000 Other Funds. This amount includes a one-time cost of \$10,000 to translate the test to Spanish; as well as continuing biennial costs of \$48,000 to cover the

costs for exam proctors; \$12,000 for exam committee expenses; \$20,000 for testing materials; \$5,000 for rental of testing site; and \$10,000 for publication and outreach.

The bill allows the board to establish fees for applicants to offset the full cost of administering the exam and classes. The board will fine-tune the calculations of the cost of complying with the provisions of this bill, explore ways to offer these new test and class options with existing study resources and translation efforts, and work with stakeholders to determine a fair and reasonable fee to offset the full cost. This fiscal assumes LCB will need to implement fee increases or new testing fees in the 2017-2019 biennium as a result of this bill. This new fee structure will be included in the required report to the legislature.

Note that the Landscape Contractors Board is a semi-independent state agency subject to ORS 182.456 to 182.472. The agency's budget is not subject to Executive Branch review, or approval or modification by the Legislative Assembly.

The -A7 amendment

The –A7 amendment:

- Removes emergency clause.
- Provides that practical skills test option applies to limited and specialty license.
- Allows board to test the ability of an applicant to plan and install fences, decks, arbors, patios, landscape edging, driveways, walkways or retaining walls.
- Prohibits board from testing the ability of an applicant to install backflow.
- Requires board consult with the State Plumbing Board in developing any written and practical examinations for backflow assembly installer licenses.
- Requires board to make any written backflow assembly installer licensing available with Spanish upon request of applicant.
- Moves date that board must make the practical skills test available from September 15, 2016 to May 15, 2017.
- Moves date that board is required to report to the Legislative Assembly from September 15, 2016 to May 15, 2017.

The –A7 amendment does not change the original fiscal determination.

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

[Eliminates examination and experience requirements for licensing as landscape construction professional. Eliminates probationary landscape construction professional license. Eliminates examination and education requirements for landscape contracting business license applicants.]

Allows applicant for licensing as landscape construction professional to take practical skills test and attend class on landscape contracting business practices as alternative to taking written examination. Provides guidelines for carrying out of practical skills test and business practices class.

Provides that fees paid by applicants taking practical skills test be set in amount sufficient to fully offset cost of practical skills testing and business practices class. Allows State Landscape Contractors Board to subcontract or otherwise arrange for third party carrying out of practical skills testing or business practices class.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- (4) The board shall supply a site for practical skills testing that has adequate lighting and is free from extreme temperatures, high winds and heavy rainfall. The practical skills test must be conducted within an eight-hour period on a single day.
- (5) The board shall evaluate task performance during a practical skills test by use of a standardized scoring checklist. If the evaluator determines that an item on the checklist was not performed in a manner meeting or exceeding industry standards, the board shall provide written comments explaining in detail why the performance was unsatisfactory. The board shall establish the minimum score for passage of a practical skills test to be 70 percent of the maximum possible score. If an applicant does not pass a practical skills test, the board shall allow the applicant to review the checklist and written comments. If the applicant takes the practical skills test prior to the last day of a test availability period described in subsection (2) of this section, the board shall allow the applicant the opportunity to pay a new examination fee and retake the test during that same availability period.
- (6) The board shall offer or approve a class on landscape contracting business practices, not to exceed six hours in length. The class shall be offered to applicants who have successfully completed the practical skills test and be available during the same periods that practical skills testing is available. The board may not test applicants on the class content. An applicant who passes the practical skills test and attends the business practices class satisfies the examination requirement established in ORS 671.570 (1)(d).
- (7) The board shall establish fees for applicants described in this section in amounts reasonably calculated to offset the full program cost of conducting the practical skills test and business practices class described in this section.
- (8) The board may subcontract or otherwise arrange for a third party to carry out any duty or function of the board regarding practical skills testing or the class on landscape contracting business practices.
- <u>SECTION 2.</u> The State Landscape Contractors Board shall make practical skills testing and business practices classes available under section 1 of this 2015 Act no later than May 1, 2016.
- SECTION 3. The State Landscape Contractors Board shall report to the Seventy-eighth Legislative Assembly in the manner provided in ORS 192.245 no later than September 15, 2016, regarding the implementation of the practical skills test and business practices class required under section 1 of this 2015 Act. The report must include, but need not be limited to, information regarding the content of the practical skills test, the date that the board first offered practical skills testing, the number and percentage of applicants for licensing as landscape construction professionals taking the practical skills test, the number and percentage of applicants passing the practical skills test and the number and percentage of applicants passing a written licensing examination.
 - **SECTION 4.** ORS 671.570 is amended to read:
 - 671.570. (1) Each person applying for a landscape construction professional license must:

Measure Description:

Requires Landscape Contractors Board to make available practical skills test, and to offer exams in Spanish.

Government Unit(s) Affected:

Local Government Mandate:

Analysis:

House Bill 3304 with the – A7 amendment requires the Landscape Contractors Board (LCB) to design and make available a practical skills test for persons applying for a landscape construction professional license. The bill requires the board to offer the option of practical skills tests, and to offer practical skills tests and written exams in Spanish. The bill requires the board to offer or approve a class on landscape contracting business practices. The board is directed to report to the legislature by May 15, 2017 regarding the implementation of these options.

Passage of this bill will have an Other Fund impact to the agency's fee structure. If this bill passes, the board will have to either contract with vendors or develop in-house capacity to supply the exam materials, scoring tools for the exam, proctors for the exams, and change its forms and applications to allow for the option of requesting: 1) a written exam or a practical skills test; and 2) practical skills tests and written exams in Spanish. At this time, the board is working to quantify these costs fully. The Legislative Fiscal Office offers the following information as a point of reference: Currently, the board has approximately 1,350 individual licensees and 1,164 business licensees. At present, the cost for the written six-section exam is \$65 for the first section, and \$10 for each additional section taken at the same time. Based on the last three biennia, the board has received an average of 168 testing applicants per biennium.

The board predicts a rough estimate of the total direct cost of offering the testing options required by this bill to be approximately \$105,000 Other Funds. This amount includes a one-time cost of \$10,000 to translate the test to Spanish; as well as continuing biennial costs of \$48,000 to cover the costs for exam proctors; \$12,000 for exam committee expenses; \$20,000 for testing materials; \$5,000 for rental of testing site; and \$10,000 for publication and outreach.

BACKGROUND:

Created in 1972, the State Landscape Contractors Board (LCB) licenses landscape contracting businesses and landscape construction professionals. Landscape construction professionals must meet experience and/or education requirements and pass a competency exam. Landscape contracting businesses must obtain a surety bond, submit evidence of liability insurance and employ or be owned by a licensed landscape construction professional. A landscape construction professional license applicant must pass an examination, and must have at least 24 months of employment with a landscape contracting business or at least 12 months of employment with a landscape contracting business with one full year of training in an area related to landscaping from an accredited school. A probationary license can be issued if the applicant does not meet the training and experience requirements but meets the requirements of a probationary license. An applicant for a landscape contracting business license must show proof that the owner or managing employee, if not a licensed landscape professional, has completed required courses and passed an examination.

Measure Description:

Requires Landscape Contractors Board to make available practical skills test, and to offer exams in Spanish.

Government Unit(s) Affected:

Landscape Contractors Board [Semi-Independent Agency]

Local Government Mandate:

This bill does not affect local governments' service levels or shared revenues sufficient to trigger Section 15, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

Analysis:

House Bill 3304 requires the Landscape Contractors Board (LCB) to design and make available a practical skills test for persons applying for a landscape construction professional license. The bill requires the board to offer the option of practical skills tests, and to offer practical skills tests and written exams in Spanish. The bill requires the board to offer or approve a class on landscape contracting business practices. The board is directed to report to the legislature by September 15, 2016 regarding the implementation of these options.

Passage of this bill will have an Other Fund impact to the agency's fee structure. If this bill passes, the board will have to either contract with vendors or develop in-house capacity to supply the exam materials, scoring tools for the exam, proctors for the exams, and change its forms and applications to allow for the option of requesting: 1) a written exam or a practical skills test; and 2) practical skills tests and written exams in Spanish. At this time, the board is working to quantify these costs fully. The Legislative Fiscal Office offers the following information as a point of reference: Currently, the board has approximately 1,350 individual licensees and 1,164 business licensees. At present, the cost for the written six-section exam is \$65 for the first section, and \$10 for each additional section taken at the same time. Based on the last three biennia, the board has received an average of 168 testing applicants per biennium.

The board predicts a rough estimate of the total direct cost of offering the testing options required by this bill to be approximately \$105,000 Other Funds. This amount includes a one-time cost of \$10,000 to translate the test to Spanish; as well as continuing biennial costs of \$48,000 to cover the costs for exam proctors; \$12,000 for exam committee expenses; \$20,000 for testing materials; \$5,000 for rental of testing site; and \$10,000 for publication and outreach.

The bill allows the board to establish fees for applicants to offset the full cost of administering the exam and classes. The board will fine-tune the calculations of the cost of complying with the provisions of this bill, explore ways to offer these new test and class options with existing study resources and translation efforts, and work with stakeholders to determine a fair and reasonable fee to offset the full cost. This fiscal assumes LCB will need to implement fee increases or new testing fees in the 2017-2019 biennium as a result of this bill. This new fee structure will be included in the required report to the legislature.

Note that the Landscape Contractors Board is a semi-independent state agency subject to ORS 182.456 to 182.472. The agency's budget is not subject to Executive Branch review, or approval or modification by the Legislative Assembly.

WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Allows person applying for landscape construction professional license to satisfy examination requirement by either passing written examination or passing eight-hour skills test and attending six-hour business practices class. Requires Landscape Contractors Board to offer practical skills testing three weeks each year starting May 1, 2016. Directs Board to establish applicant fee to offset full cost of practical skills test and business practices class. Requires written examination to be translated to Spanish by January 1, 2016. Requires Board to report to Legislative Assembly by September 15, 2016, regarding implementation of practical skills test and business practices class. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Lack of exam and study materials being offered in Spanish
- Licensing meant to protect consumers
- Problems that occur when landscapers operate without license
- Examination passage rates

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:

Replaces original measure.

BACKGROUND:

Created in 1972, the State Landscape Contractors Board (LCB) licenses landscape contracting businesses and landscape construction professionals. Landscape construction professionals must meet experience and/or education requirements and pass a competency exam. Landscape contracting businesses must obtain a surety bond, submit evidence of liability insurance and employ or be owned by a licensed landscape construction professional. A landscape construction professional license applicant must pass an examination, and must have at least 24 months of employment with a landscape contracting business or at least 12 months of employment with a landscape contracting business with one full year of training in an area related to landscaping from an accredited school. A probationary license can be issued if the applicant does not meet the training and experience requirements but meets the requirements of a probationary license. An applicant for a landscape contracting business license must show proof that the owner or managing employee, if not a licensed landscape professional, has completed required courses and passed an examination.
