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Testimony in Support of HB 3525 Monday June 15, 2015, 1 pm, H-170 Joint Subcommittee on General Government

Dear Co-Chairs Smith and Steiner Hayward, Rep. Heard, Rep. Komp, Rep. Nathanson, Rep. Taylor, Sen. Johnson and Sen. Whitsett,

The Oregon Commissions on Asian and Pacific Islander Affairs and Hispanic Affairs support HB 3525. This bill addresses a serious issue in our community – that of unlicensed non-lawyer "immigration consultants" (often referred to as "notarios") which prey on certain members of the public. Unlicensed immigration consultants are already prohibited under ORS 9.280. Some notarios use coercion and extortion to discourage members of the public from reporting them for their illegal practices. HB 3525 addresses this problem by providing that using intimidation or fear to prevent a person from reporting violations of ORS 9.280 is a Class A misdemeanor.

HB 3525 gives law enforcement a tool to investigate, charge, and prosecute egregious violations of Oregon's unlawful practice of law statute. It also encourages victims of those crimes to feel comfortable meeting with law enforcement.
