Subject:	SB 895 Relating to child immunizations Work Session Recommendation

Senate Bill 895 requires schools and children facilities to report annually to the Oregon Health Authority on the number of children served by the school or facility who are in attendance conditionally because of an incomplete immunization schedule. The bill also requires local health departments to make available data on the immunization rate, by disease, of children in the area. OHA is required to help compile this data if requested. Schools and children facilities are, in turn, required to make this information available to parents

The measure previously had hearings in the Senate Committee on Education on 4/9/2015 and 4/21/2015.

WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Requires each school and children's facility report annually to Oregon Health Authority (OHA) on number of children in area served by school or facility who are in attendance conditionally because of incomplete immunization schedule. Requires each local health department make available to each school and children's facility in area served data on immunization rate, by disease, of children in area. Allows OHA to assist local health departments in compiling data for specified data. Requires each school and children's facility make available immunization data by disease at main office, online where possible, and through specified paper document or electronic communication. Specifies timeline for providing immunization data. Requires Superintendent of Public Instruction include in school district and school performance report information related to number of children served in district and number of children susceptible to restrictable disease. Repeals section 4, chapter 516, Oregon Laws 2013. Declare emergency, effective on passage.

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:

Replaces the measure.

BACKGROUND:

Under ORS 433.269, local health departments are required to provide immunizations at convenient times and locations, to be administered under the direction of the local health officer. The local health department and each school and children's facility are required to report annually to the OHA on the number of children in the area served and the number of children who are susceptible to restrictable disease. Students exempted under ORS

433.267 are considered susceptible. Additionally, the administrator is required to maintain immunization records of children, including children in conditional attendance due to incomplete immunizations or exemptions.

Senate Bill 895-A requires specific reporting, posting, and communication of aggregate data on immunization rates for OHA, local health departments, schools, children's facilities, and the Superintendent of Public Instruction.

The bill additionally repeals section 4, chapter 516, Oregon Laws 2013. Section 4 excused children who had received exemptions from immunization prior to the passage of the Act from undertaking the new requirements for exemption that were established in 2013. Repealing section 4 would consequently require all children, as a condition of attendance in any school or children's facility, to adhere to the guidelines for receiving an accepted exemption from immunization as established in ORS 433.267 (immunization of school children).

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Requires schools and children's facilities to make available certain information related to immunizations.

Directs Superintendent of Public Instruction to include certain information related to immunizations on school district and school performance reports.

Makes certain provisions relating to immunization apply to all children attending school or children's facility during or after 2015-2016 school year. Declares emergency, effective on passage.
