

**HB 3099**

**Relating to state information technology**

---

HB 3099 relates to state information technology. The measure transfers certain duties, functions and powers related to enterprise information technology and telecommunications operations, service delivery, planning, policy adoption, rulemaking, standards setting and oversight from the Department of Administrative Services to the State Chief Information Officer.

The measure provides that the State Chief Information Officer is the primary information technology and telecommunications advisor to the Governor and that the State Chief Information Officer's duties are specified by the Governor.

The measure also:

- Requires DAS and state agencies to follow information technology plans, rules, policies and standards adopted by the State CIO.
- Provides the State CIO with enhanced powers for oversight of information technology projects and procurements.
- Requires the Secretary of State and the State Treasurer to submit specified documents and reports to the Legislative Fiscal Officer and to adopt information technology plans, policies, and standards that are, to the extent possible, compatible with those adopted by the State CIO for all other executive branch state agencies.

The Information Technology Subcommittee recommended to the General Government Subcommittee – and the General Government Subcommittee now recommends to the Full Committee – that HB 3099 be amended by the -A13 amendment and be reported out do pass, as amended.
