Subject: HB 3063 Work Session Recommendations

HB 3063 - Relates to assistance for community college students. This bill appropriates \$3 million General Fund to the Department of Community Colleges and Workforce Development (CCWD), for a grant program to community colleges so that they may increase the number of underserved, low-income and first-generation college-bound students who enroll in community college and make progress toward a degree or a certificate.

The measure previously had a public hearing in the Joint Ways and Means Subcommittee on Education on June 9, 2015.

The measure has a \$3 million General Fund impact in the 2015-17 biennium.

#### Amendments

The proposed - 4 amendment changes the appropriation entity to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission rather than the Department of Community Colleges and Workforce Development. The amendment also contains language from the -1amendment which adds foundations of community colleges as permissible organizations for which the grant moneys may be distributed to.

#### Analysis:

This bill appropriates \$3 million General Fund to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission (HECC), for a grant program to community colleges or any foundations of community colleges, so that they may increase the number of underserved, low-income and first-generation college-bound students who enroll in community college and make progress toward a degree or a certificate.

The fiscal impact to the HECC for reviewing grant proposals, as well as awarding and monitoring the grant awards is anticipated to be minimal and absorbable within the existing parameters of the agency budget.

In line 2 of the printed bill, after the semicolon insert "creating new provisions; amending section 1, chapter 51, Oregon Laws 2014;".

4 "SECTION 1. Section 1, chapter 51, Oregon Laws 2014, is amended to 5 read:

6 "Sec. 1. (1) The Department of Community Colleges and Workforce De-7 velopment and the Higher Education Coordinating Commission shall jointly 8 establish a grant program for the purpose of distributing moneys to commu-9 nity colleges, or any foundations of community colleges, to increase the 10 number of underserved, low-income and first-generation college-bound stu-11 dents who enroll in community college and make progress toward a degree 12 or a certificate.

"(2) Moneys distributed under subsection (1) of this section may be used by a community college, or a foundation of a community college, for services that are designed to increase student enrollment, retention and degree and certificate completion, including counseling programs, college initiatives, advising services and assistance in obtaining financial aid.

"(3) The Higher Education Coordinating Commission may adopt rules necessary for the administration of this section, including rules that set standards for awarding grants. The standards shall give priority to community colleges, or foundations of community colleges, that have student enrollment, retention and degree and certificate completion programs with demonstrated support from the private sector, the community and local government.".
