

SB 612

Relating to dyslexia

SB 612 directs the Oregon Department of Education to establish a state dyslexia specialist, and to create a plan to screen for dyslexia and provide notifications for students at risk for dyslexia.

The Joint Committee on Ways and Means previously approved this bill, and it has passed the Senate.

The -B10 amendment resolves conflicts with SB 215 by making SB 215 the controlling legislation for certain statutes; SB 215 extends the sunset of the Oregon Education Investment Board.

I recommend SB 612 be amended by the -B10 conflict amendment and be reported out do pass, as amended.
