The Association of Oregon Recyclers (AOR) is a trade association focused on advancing waste prevention and recycling in Oregon. AOR supports SB 263-A.

SB 263-A is the result of a multi-year stakeholder process to evaluate potential updates to Oregon's solid waste and recycling statutes. The proposal represents an important opportunity to reduce waste and increase composting and recycling in Oregon. Stakeholders have played a key role in the development of SB 263-A, participating in DEQ workgroups and providing ongoing feedback to the proposals. SB 263-A reflects stakeholder input and represents many points of compromise.

SB 263-A modernizes decades-old recycling and waste prevention statutes and goals. The proposal expands program options and updates local and statewide material recovery goals. DEQ held public meetings across the state to develop aspirational goals and program elements, and AOR supports the proposed updates.

This legislation is key to implementing *Materials Management in Oregon: 2050 Vision and Framework for Action*, adopted by Oregon Environmental Quality Commission in 2012. AOR is committed to achieving a system of sustainable materials management and supports these proposals as an important next step.
