## **BACKGROUND:**

Officer Jimmy Lee Shoop was killed in the line of duty on November 7. 1981.

Officer Shoop was born on September 26, 1947, in Imperial, Nebraska. He was adopted, along with his twin sister Janet Faye Shoop, by Mona and Charles Shoop of Portland, Oregon. After graduating from David Douglas High School, in 1965, he began working the night shift, part-time, as a reserve sheriff in Estacada and he joined the Clackamas County Sheriff's Office after graduating from the Police Academy in 1978.

He loved his work, enjoyed fishing in his spare time and was a very family-oriented man who was loved by many. He is survived by his sister, his wife and his three children.
