Measure Description:

Defines "inhalant delivery system." Amends laws concerning sale of tobacco products to, and use of tobacco products by, minors so those laws equally apply to inhalant delivery systems.

Government Unit(s) Affected:

Oregon Health Authority (OHA), Oregon Liquor Control Commission (OLCC), Department of Corrections, Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ), Department of Justice, Judicial Department, Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT), cities, counties

Analysis:
