Allows individuals found guilty except for insanity and juveniles found responsible except for insanity to have their records expunged or sealed.

Currently, ORS 419A-260-262 defines and outlines the expunction processes and proceedings. House Bill 2557-A allows individuals found guilty except for insanity and juveniles found responsible except for insanity to have their records expunged or sealed.
