# **EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:**

No amendment.

## **BACKGROUND:**

An Oregon Trail Card is an Electronic Benefits Transfer (EBT) card, similar to a debit card from a bank. The Department of Human Services (DHS) sets up Oregon Trail accounts for eligible individuals and families that receive state assistance, and deposits benefits into the accounts each month that can be accessed using the card. Oregon Trail Cards are used mostly for food benefits from the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), but are also used for cash benefits through the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) program, and other forms of assistance. Account holders' names are not currently stamped on Oregon Trail Cards.

House Bill 2392 requires DHS to put the names of all adults authorized to use an Oregon Trail EBT Card, on the face of the card.
