**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:**

Raises limit on fees for annual registration of animal remedy, veterinary biologic or pharmaceutical from \$75 to \$150.  
Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2015.

**ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

- Provisions of measure

**EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:**

No amendment.

**BACKGROUND:**

An animal remedy means any product used to prevent, inhibit or cure illness or enhance or protect the health or well-being of animals. Oregon law requires any animal remedy, veterinary biologic or pharmaceutical to be registered with the Oregon Department of Agriculture. The current registration fee is \$75.00 per product, per year.

Senate Bill 255 raises the limit on fees for annual registration of animal remedy, veterinary biologic or pharmaceutical to \$150.
