#### WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Authorizes State Treasurer to issue lottery bonds to finance \$4 million in grants from Department of Education to school districts to pay for acquisition, construction or improvement of school-based health centers. Establishes the Oregon School-Based Health Center Construction Grant Fund. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

#### **ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

- 2011-12 federal capital grants for school-based health centers (SBHCs) in Oregon
- Importance of bonding authority
- SBHCs and access to health care
- SBHCs and public health
- Positive impacts on students and education outcomes

### **EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:**

Specifies a \$4 million other fund allocation.

## BACKGROUND:

School-based health centers (SBHCs) are primary care clinics located on primary and secondary school campuses. SBHCs are a public health model of a pediatric clinic, and operate through public-private partnerships. Generally, they are an integrated practice that provides primary, behavioral, preventive and mental health services.

In 2011-12, federal funds were made available for SBHC capital construction grants. Oregon benefited from these funds, with approximately \$370,000 having been distributed to 20 sites in 12 counties. In October 2014, the Oregon Health Authority SBHC Program conducted a needs assessment, surveying 26 public health departments to identify the interest in a new SBHC development.
