## WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Declares intent of Legislative Assembly to embody sporting ethic of fair chase as it relates to use of drones in pursuit of wildlife. Directs Fish and Wildlife Commission (Commission) to adopt rules prohibiting use of drones for pursuit of wildlife in angling; hunting; trapping; harassing, tracking, locating, or scouting wildlife; or interfering in act of person lawfully engaged in angling, hunting or trapping. Authorizes Commission to includes exemptions from prohibition for Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife and its agents or contractors or if purpose is to benefit wildlife management or protect property. Defines "drone." Stipulates nothing in the bill is meant to limit use of drones by person lawfully engaged in activities authorized under commercial fishing laws.

## **BACKGROUND:**

Drone technology has become more affordable in recent years and there is evidence that drones are already being used by some to aid in hunting and fishing activity and by others to interfere with those engaged in lawful hunting and fishing activity. Several states have moved to ban the use of drone technology for such purposes.

House Bill 2534A would direct the Fish and Wildlife Commission to adopt rules prohibiting the use of drones for hunting, angling, harassing and tracking wildlife and interfering with lawful angling or hunting.
