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Measure Description:

Requires school district to provide instruction in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and uses of automated external defibrillators.

Government Unit(s) Affected:

Department of Education, School Districts

Summary of Expenditure Impact:

Local Government Mandate:

This bill does not affect local governments' service levels or shared revenues sufficient to trigger Section 15, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

Analysis:

The proposed legislation has been determined to have a minimal expenditure impact on the Oregon Department of Education. While this individual measure has a “Minimal” fiscal impact, the agency may incur a net fiscal impact greater than minimal depending on the cumulative impact of all measures enacted into law that affect the agency.

The bill may increase costs for school districts related to acquiring supplies to teach hands-on practicing of cardio pulmonary recitation (CPR); such supplies may include printed materials, defibrillators, or mannequins. Furthermore, the bill may increase liability to school districts by allowing licensed teachers, who are not certified to administer CPR, to provide instruction; the fiscal impact of increased liability to school districts is not quantifiable and indeterminate at this time.
