WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Directs Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) and Oregon Parks and Recreation Department (OPRD) to provide link from ODOT website to OPRD website for purpose of providing information about how to purchase day-use parking passes for state parks requiring pass. Directs OPRD to work with ODOT and other state agencies to provide certain information regarding purchase of day-use parking passes at ODOT field offices where applications for driver licenses or vehicle registrations are accepted.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Revenue potential from sales of day-use parking passes
- Cost savings to frequent users of parking passes
- Successful efforts in other states

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:

No amendment.

BACKGROUND:

The ODOT website does not provide a link to the OPRD website that would provide easy access to information about how to purchase day-use parking passes.

House Bill 2184 would require a cooperative effort between the two agencies to create such a link. The bill would also require OPRD to coordinate with other state agencies to provide website links, informational brochures, applications and other materials about how to purchase day-use parking passes.
