BACKGROUND:

The University of Oregon (Oregon) football program has been steadily building its reputation as a team that can hold its own against any storied football powerhouse school in the nation.

Oregon's historic and record-breaking 2014 college football season under head football coach Mark Helfrich, secured its place in the first-ever College Football Playoff National Championship game, despite numerous injuries to key players and an early defeat by the Arizona Wildcats. Oregon's presence in the College Football Playoff National Championship Game was its second-ever national championship game appearance, the first being the Bowl Championship Series National Championship Game in 2011.

In addition, Oregon quarterback Marcus Mariota is the first Oregon player to win the Heisman Trophy, having received the second-highest percentage of possible points in Heisman history. He secured the Pac-12 record for career total touchdowns and single-season total touchdowns, as well as the Oregon team record for career total offensive yards, career passing yards, career passing touchdowns, single-season total offensive yards, single-season passing yards and single-season passing touchdowns.
