Measure Description:

Makes legislative findings regarding provision of antibiotics and its relation to public health.

Government Unit(s) Affected:

Oregon Health Authority (OHA), Department of Agriculture

Local Government Mandate:

This bill does not affect local governments' service levels or shared revenues sufficient to trigger Section 15, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

Analysis:

This fiscal impact statement is for the purpose of transmitting Senate Bill 920 from the Senate Committee on Health Care to the Senate Committee on Rules.

The bill prohibits livestock producers from providing a medically important antibiotic to a food-producing animal for a nontherapeutic purpose with certain exceptions. In addition, the bill requires livestock producers to file an annual report containing specified information to the Oregon Health Authority.

The bill is anticipated to have a fiscal impact on the Oregon Health Authority and the Department of Agriculture. The amount of this impact is still being determined.

A more complete fiscal analysis on the bill will be prepared as the measure is considered in the Senate Committee on Rules.
