## WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Adds threatening to cause physical injury to animal to induce other person to engage in certain conduct as conduct constituting crime of coercion.

## **BACKGROUND:**

Multiple studies show a direct link between violence against animals and violence against humans, especially within the context of domestic violence where abusers use animals – specifically the threat of harming an animal – as a means of achieving submission.

House Bill 3468 makes it a crime of coercion when one compels or induces another person to engage in certain conduct by instilling fear that they will cause physical injury to an animal.
