**Measure Description:**

Increases time for conducting preliminary hearing on minor's application for emancipation to 15 days after date of filing.

**Impact Explanation:**

The violation Class A and B are modeled after the alcohol violations. With adjustments to the expected lower volumes due to lack of consumption establishments, unlike bars and taverns where alcohol is consumed. Moreover, marijuana already is sold in the black market and it is necessarily easier for under age consumers to obtain outside the legal channels. This might bring the total to less than half of what the alcohol violations are today. The Average fine for an A class violation is \$252 and class B is \$223. The number of total violation is expected to follow the percentage of collection n= rate of 75% and convection of 80%.
