WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Establishes Oregon Main Street Revitalization Grant Program within Oregon Business Development Department for purpose of awarding grants to participants in Oregon Main Street Network and members of National Main Street Center for purposes of preservation-based community revitalization and economic development. Establishes Oregon Main Street Revitalization Grant Program Fund and continuously appropriates moneys in Fund to Department for purposes of the program. Authorizes issuance of sufficient amount in lottery bonds for 2015-17 biennium for \$5 million to be deposited into Fund. Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2015.
