WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Prohibits use of expulsion to address truancy. Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2015.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- History of exclusionary discipline for truant behavior
- Negative effects of exclusionary discipline on truant students
- Effects of exclusionary discipline on students remaining in the classroom
- Ability to continue to address truancy with suspension

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:

No amendment.

BACKGROUND:

House Bill 2192-B (2013) established requirements for school policies related to discipline, suspension, and expulsion. While that measure limited expulsions, ORS 339.250 currently allows expulsion as a disciplinary measure to address truancy.

Senate Bill 556 amends ORS 339.250 to prohibit the use of expulsion to address truancy.
