WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Reinstates statutes relating to requirements for community health improvement plans adopted by coordinated care organizations (CCOs) and their community advisory council which sunset on the convening of the 2015 Legislative Assembly. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Options available to communities
- Importance of building cooperation
- Need to keep school-based health centers involved with the community health improvement plans
- Concerns relating to parental consent and minors
- Proposed amendment

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:

No amendment.

BACKGROUND:

Senate Bill 436, passed in 2013, required coordinated care organizations (CCOs) and community advisory councils to adopt health improvement plans that included the use of school-based health centers, to maximize resources at the local level and bring children's programs and providers together. Senate Bill 902 lifts the sunset on the requirement to include school-based health centers in community health improvement plans, to ensure continuing coordination.
