## BACKGROUND:

The Portland Winterhawks are a major junior ice hockey team based in Portland, Oregon, playing in the Western Hockey League since the 1976-1977 season.

The Portland Winterhawks have won four consecutive Western Hockey League Western Conference championships, taking home the title in 2011, 2012, 2013 and 2014. They are only the fourth team in league history, and the first since 1978, to win four consecutive championship titles. The teams recent, and historical success, combined with the high caliber of its players, has led to over 100 Winterhawks alumni going on to play in the National Hockey League.

In addition, the Portland Winterhawks are actively involved with local youth throughout the Northwest. The Portland Winterhawks Hockey Club and Winterhawks Skating Center enable the Winterhawks to promote active and healthy lifestyles by introducing children throughout Oregon and southwest Washington to ice sports as lifelong options for fitness and recreation.
