Minimal Revenue Impact

SB 844 with the -43 amendment shortens waiting period to one year for offenses in which possession, delivery or manufacture of marijuana is an element. Applications of expunction and setting aside the conviction are expected to increase. In addition, this measure applies retroactively to adjudications and convictions made prior to the effective date of this measure. Therefore, it is anticipate to increase the number of expunction and set aside motions filed with the circuit courts for the 2015-2017, 2017-2019, and some in the 2019-2021 biennia. After that time, the filling number of these motions in the circuit courts is expected to stabilize. This might show an increase in the filling fees and related amounts through the court system, however, the amounts are not large enough to be considered a significant increase in court fees revenue.
