Measure Description: Prohibits school districts from receiving State School Fund (SSF) distributions for certain high school students enrolled in college level courses offered through community colleges or Oregon's public universities. Creates exceptions to this prohibition. Applies provisions to the 2015-16 school year. Repeals the prohibition on July 1, 2016. Takes effect on passage.

Revenue Impact (in \$Millions): This bill does not change the total formula revenue available for distribution to school districts and education service districts.

Impact Explanation: SB 898 specifies that a school district may not receive SSF distributions for a student who has satisfied the requirements for a high school diploma, remains enrolled at a school district, and has enrolled in one or more college-level courses. However, by creating exceptions to this prohibition and grandfathering in SSF distribution eligibility for certain students, the bill will have negligible impact, if any, on the 2015-16 SSF distribution.
