House Bill 2021

Sponsored by Representatives HAYDEN, KENY-GUYER; Representatives BUEHLER, HACK, PILUSO, TAYLOR, Senator GIROD

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Directs Oregon Health Authority to develop and implement pilot program through which authority and Department of Education provide services related to oral health education, use of fluoride varnish and daily brushing and flossing for children.

Sunsets on date of convening of 2018 regular session of Legislative Assembly.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to oral health; and declaring an emergency.
 - Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
 - <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The Oregon Health Authority, in conjunction with the Department of Education, shall develop and implement a pilot program through which the authority and department provide services related to oral health education, use of fluoride varnish and daily brushing and flossing for children who:
 - (a) Attend a public school in this state; and
 - (b) Are enrolled in kindergarten or first grade.
 - (2) As part of the pilot program, the authority shall:
- 11 (a) Select school districts to participate in the program;
 - (b) Assist selected school districts in implementing the program;
 - (c) Develop a process by which the parent or legal guardian of a child may opt out of the child's participation in the program; and
 - (d) Administer fluoride varnish twice to each child participating in the program.
 - (3) At least 800 children must participate in the pilot program.
 - (4) The authority shall implement the pilot program during the 2016-2017 school year.
 - (5) The Department of Education shall assist the authority in fulfilling its duties under subsection (2) of this section.
 - (6) The authority shall make a report on the development and implementation of the pilot program. As part of the report, the authority shall estimate the cost of providing and administering the services described in subsection (1) of this section statewide. The authority shall submit the report to an interim committee of the Legislative Assembly related to health no later than September 15, 2017.
 - <u>SECTION 2.</u> Section 1 of this 2015 Act is repealed on the date of the convening of the 2018 regular session of the Legislative Assembly as specified in ORS 171.010.
 - <u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect on its passage.

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
