House Bill 2023

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Specifies requirements for hospital protocol for discharge planning involving patient who is hospitalized for behavioral health crisis.

A BILL FOR AN ACT 1 Relating to protocols for a health care facility's discharge of a patient who presented with a be-2 havioral health crisis. 3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 4 SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2015 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 441.015 to $\mathbf{5}$ 441.063. 6 7 SECTION 2. (1) A hospital shall develop, implement and enforce a protocol for the discharge of a patient who is hospitalized, for treatment or for observation, for a behavioral 8 health crisis. The protocol must include: 9 (a) Locating a family member, or other appropriate person, who is willing and able to 10 assist the patient after discharge; 11 12 (b) Encouraging the patient to sign an authorization for the release of information necessary for a family member or other appropriate person to meaningfully participate in the 13discharge planning and support of the patient upon discharge; 14 (c) Documenting efforts to involve a family member or other appropriate person in dis-15 16 charge planning; 17(d) Documenting the patient's and the family member or other appropriate person's willingness to follow through with the discharge plan; 18 19 (e) Allowing the patient's physician or mental health treatment provider to involve a 20 family member or other appropriate person in discharge planning without the patient's consent if the patient expresses suicidal ideation, or the physician or provider believes in good 2122faith that the patient poses a threat to the patient's own health and safety or the health and 23safety of others; (f) Assessing the long term needs of the patient and developing a plan to ensure that the 24patient's needs are met; 25 26 (g) Coordinating the patient's care with the patient's employment or educational needs; and 27 (h) Meeting any applicable outcome and quality measures established by the Oregon 28 Health Authority. 29 30 (2) The hospital shall make publicly available the protocol described in subsection (1) of this section. 31

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
