House Bill 2393

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires Oregon State Lottery to hold lottery prize in excess of \$600 that is owed to person that has not repaid overpayment of public assistance or medical assistance benefits.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to recovery from lottery prize of overpayment of public benefits.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2015 Act is added to and made a part of ORS chapter 461.

5 **SECTION 2.** (1) As used in this section:

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6 (a) "Medical assistance" has the meaning given that term in ORS 414.025.

7 (b) "Public assistance" has the meaning given that term in ORS 411.010.

8 (2) The Oregon State Lottery Commission, by rule, shall develop procedures whereby:

9 (a) Before paying any portion of a lottery prize in excess of \$600, the Director of the 10 Oregon State Lottery must check the names of the persons entitled to payment against a 11 computer database containing the names and Social Security numbers of persons that have 12 received an overpayment of public assistance or medical assistance for which the Depart-13 ment of Human Services or the Oregon Health Authority has a warrant under ORS 411.703.

14 (b) When the person is listed in the database, the commission shall:

15 (A) Place a 30-day hold on any payment to the person;

16 (B) Inform the person of the hold; and

17 (C) Notify the department or the authority that a recipient of an overpayment of public 18 assistance or medical assistance has won a lottery prize in excess of \$600 or is entitled to 19 payment in excess of \$600 on a lottery prize.

(c) If a garnishment proceeding is initiated under ORS 18.600 to 18.850 within the 30-day
 hold period, the commission must continue to hold any payment to the person pending disposition of the proceeding.

(d) If a garnishment proceeding is not initiated under ORS 18.600 to 18.850 within the
30-day hold period or the department or authority notifies the commission that a
garnishment proceeding will not be initiated, whichever is sooner, the commission shall pay
the prize to the person at the end of the 30-day hold period.

(3) The commission shall establish and operate a data match system using automated data exchanges with the department and the authority that identifies persons that have received an overpayment of public assistance or medical assistance for which a warrant has been issued under ORS 411.703. Any information necessary to identify the person and hold a payment on a prize must be available to the commission through the data match system.

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1 (4) The commission shall enter into an agreement regarding the procedures required by 2 subsections (1) and (2) of this section with the department and the authority.

3 <u>SECTION 3.</u> Section 2 of this 2015 Act applies to an overpayment of public assistance or 4 medical assistance for which a warrant is first issued under ORS 411.703 on or after the ef-5 fective date of this 2015 Act.

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
